Dear Parents and Guardians

All voluntary contributions and charges have been reviewed and approved by the School Finance Committee and the School Board. This booklet is designed to give parents/guardians detailed information pertaining to the structure of contributions/charges together with payment and assistance options.

Exmouth District High School is funded by the Western Australian Department of Education. Like all schools in the State, funding is linked to the number of enrolments at the commencement of the school year. Funding is provided at a fixed amount per student.

Contrary to popular belief there is no 'top up' payment by the Department of Education to the school, if delivered programs and resources exceed its budget.

The payment of Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges is an opportunity for parents and guardians to directly assist the school with its funding. The greater the locally raised funds, the more opportunity the school has to deliver additional programs and resources.

The School Board strongly encourages you to directly support the school and your child/children's education by paying the Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges as outlined.

Voluntary Contributions and Charges

The following information is provided in the hope of making the school contributions and charges structure clear for parents. We wish to assure parents that our efforts have been directed towards keeping the costs as low and as equitable as possible and in accordance with the Education Act regulations.

The 2021 Voluntary Contributions and Charges sheets for each year level provide details on how the voluntary contribution amounts are allocated to learning areas from Kindergarten to Year 10. Declining payments of voluntary contributions may result in poorer standard of educational material for your child/ren.

As per the Education Act Regulations all Year 11 and 12 courses incur a compulsory charge.

Information on maximum costs for other optional activities such as excursions, camps etc. that students may participate in has also been included.

Outstanding Account Statements

All current students with an outstanding account balance will receive an account statement at the start of each term.

Students with outstanding charges will retain these charges on their account, carrying over into the new school year, until paid.

Note: Please note that any payments made are applied to outstanding balances first.

Contribution & Charge Types

There are three parts to the financial requests:

1. Voluntary Contributions Kindy to Year 10:

The school is requesting a voluntary contribution of \$60.00 for primary students and \$235.00 for secondary, for each student towards the cost of materials, textbooks, services and facilities used by students in the educational program. These contributions will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs delivered. Additional compulsory charges outside the basic core program incur additional charges above this figure and can be requested for consumable and additional resources.

2. Charges:

- a. **Year 7 - 10** Elective Courses may attract a compulsory charge. **Year 11 & 12** is considered compulsory and therefore all charges are considered compulsory under the Education Act Regulations. As there is no maximum charge the school will try to keep costs to a minimum. Any parents experiencing difficulties please contact the school to explore options.
- b. **Optional activities** - any course where there is a high cost associated with their provision. E.g. excursions, camps, specific higher cost materials, competitions etc.
- c. **Other Optional School Based Activities** - address broad learning outcomes and for which there is a high cost. E.g. school social events, excursions, camps, carnivals etc. A maximum cost for these has been listed and parents only pay if their students take part. These costs will be collected throughout the year as the activities arise.

3. Additional Voluntary Approved Requests:

The following voluntary donations also appear on student Contributions and Charges sheets:

- **P & C Contribution** - Exmouth District High School P & C earnestly seek your continued support for 2021 by appealing to parents for a contribution of \$10.00 per family. Please consider becoming a member, and you are welcome to attend meetings. Membership of the P & C association is \$1.00 per family and payable at the meetings.
- **Library** - The library contribution of \$10.00 per family assists in the purchase and provision of resources for all students to use and borrow.
 - These include:
 - Fictional books
 - Information books and DVD's
 - Newspaper and magazine subscriptions

A Compassionate View

This school is only too aware that the payment of school contributions and charges can be a burden for some families. Payment plans are available to support parents experiencing difficulties. However, we do need to talk to you about this. Ignoring accounts and reminders is unhelpful to all parties. The school is also keen to assist parents in selecting options that they can afford.

Education Program Allowance

The West Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- ❖ \$115 Clothing allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian.
- ❖ \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7 - 12 at a secondary school.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- ❖ Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- ❖ Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- ❖ Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

Please Note: the only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Application Forms

Application forms are to be completed at the school during Term 1.

Applications close 1st April, 2021

Late Applications

Late applications will not be accepted unless the student has recently arrived from interstate or overseas and enrolled after the end of first term.

Contributions and Charges

Schools will receive the Educational Program Allowance of \$235 for approved recipients. In the first instance this amount will be paid directly to the school to reduce voluntary contributions in Years 7-10 and the course charges in Years 11 and 12.

Clothing Allowance

The clothing allowance of \$115 will be paid to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardians bank account.

Processing of Payments

Once the form is completed by the parent/guardian, the school will forward it to the Schools Resourcing and Budgeting Directorate for processing.

Further Information

Student Diaries

A school homework diary is provided for students in year 6 to 10. Parents are asked to encourage daily use of the student diaries.

Personal Items List

Stationery items will not be available for purchase at the school. These items can be purchased through any store of your choice. Parents will not be required to buy any textbooks for Kindy to Year 10.

The voluntary contribution amount enables the school to purchase class sets which students may borrow. If students lose textbooks or library books they will be requested to pay for the purchase of a replacement book.

Personal Items Lists and Text Book Lists will be made available on our school website and emailed out to returning families.

Calculators

All students in secondary will require a scientific calculator.

Students in year 11 & 12 studying ATAR Mathematics will require a Casio Class Pad Calculator. If students do not have one the calculator can be hired from the school library for a cost of \$50.00 per year, along with a \$50.00 refundable deposit upon return.

Uniforms

Uniforms are available from the EDHS P & C uniform shop, located at the Environment Centre. The P & C will advertise their opening times throughout the year.

If you are the holder of a Family Health Benefit Card, Pension Concession Card or Veteran Affairs Card you may be eligible to receive the **Secondary Assistance Scheme**.

The allowance consists of two components:
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 - \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school

Allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Application forms are to be completed by the parent/guardian **during Term 1**.
