



CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care - Course Outline

Qualification aim

This qualification is for people who want to work as an educator in an early childhood education and care service or family day care. This is the nationally recognised entry level qualification for working in the Early Childhood sector.

About this qualification

You will gain knowledge and skills in:

- How to use a National Framework.
- Understanding regulations and quality standards.
- Supporting the education of children in your care from birth to school age.
- Participating in curriculum development.

Units of competency outline

To achieve this qualification participants must successfully complete a total of 18 units comprising of 15 core units and three electives units.

Practical hours and placement

There is a compulsory work placement component with this qualification of 120 hours. We will work with you to ensure you have either paid or volunteer placement in a regulated education and care service to complete this course. Your workplace supervisor will be responsible for training you on workplace tasks as per the organisations policies and procedures. The student and workplace supervisor will be required to complete an observation report for each unit of competency.

Enrolment details

There are no formal entry requirements to gain entry into the Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care although a minimum level of English language, literacy and numeracy is required. You will be required to complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy Test (LLN) upon enrolment to ensure you have the correct ACSF levels to complete this course.

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Those that wish to work in the Early Childhood Education and Care sector are required to obtain a Working with Children Check.

If you already have skills and knowledge that are relevant, you may be able to apply for recognition of prior learning.

The duration of this course is two years depending on the student's learning style.
