

STUDENT DRESS CODE

The Department of Education Policy on school dress code allows schools to make the wearing of school uniforms a requirement. The School Board has endorsed a dress code for all students attending this school. The School Board believes a school dress code:

- fosters and enhances the public image of the school.
- assists in building school and team spirit.
- ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities.
- encourages equality among students.
- prepares students for the workplace, as many workplaces have dress and safety codes and expectations.

UNIFORM SHOP

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

The school staff, the School Board and the Student Leadership Team strongly support wearing a school uniform. Enrolment at the school is a commitment to meeting Dress Code Requirements.

The following student uniform garments **must** be purchased from the P&C and display the school brand.

- Polo shirts.
- Jumpers & Jackets.
- School Dress.

The following items can be purchased from a local retail or online store, have NO logos or stripes, and can be navy blue or black (preferred navy blue).

- Shorts.
- Skirt.
- Long pants.



GENERAL

- Primary students with long hair (past shoulder length) are required to tie their hair back.
- Leggings are only suitable to be worn as a part of the uniform if worn under a skirt or pair of shorts. Leggings are to be full-length and navy blue. **
- A plain Navy hoodless shirt or jumper can be worn under the school shirt. Any other colour, or anything with a hood, stripes, and logos, is unacceptable.
- Hats are to be worn at all times when outside for Primary and are highly recommended for Secondary Students.
 - Primary students broad Brimmed hats only.
 - Secondary students broad-brimmed or baseball cap style.
- Students must change into EDHS PE shirt for Physical Education – Secondary only.
- Skirts and shorts must be visible under school shirts and jumpers.
- It is a safety requirement that students attending Design and Technology, Home Economics and Science classes wear covered footwear.
- Thongs, health sandals, and 'Ugg' style boots are unacceptable. **
- Excessive make-up, including false eyelashes and jewellery, is not suitable.
- As determined by the school administration, extreme fashion or cult wear is unacceptable.
- Headscarves, which may be worn for religious or cultural reasons, are navy blue or white.
- Denim clothing is not permitted at the school.
- Leaver's jumpers and shirts are allowed to be worn for year 6 and year 12 students only.
- Full uniform is a requirement when attending school excursions unless notified differently.

** Early childhood exemptions apply.

SCHOOL UNIFORM MANAGEMENT

Students unable to meet the Student Dress Code on a given day must report to the Student Support Team to change into a loaned uniform, remove the non-uniform item, or have a parent/carer contacted to deliver appropriate uniform items before school with a valid reason.

1. A student might be given recess/lunch detention if the uniform remains inappropriate.
2. After three infringements, a letter is sent home to parents, and a meeting is organised with a member of the Student Support Team to discuss improvements.
3. After five infringements, the loss of good standing policy will be enforced, which excludes students from all non-curriculum-based events such as:
 - Sporting events.
 - Non-curricular camps and excursions.
 - School ball, socials, discos.
 - Country Week.
